

SOCIAL IMPACT SUMMARY

FISCAL YEAR 2023 (10/1/2022 - 9/30/2023)



As the *First to Believe in Small Business*, Working Solutions CDFI met and surpassed a significant milestone this year: **\$50 million in small-dollar loans and grants made to nearly 3,000 small businesses** in Northern California since inception with an all-time repayment rate of 95%. Over half of these funds have been disbursed since 2020. In FY23 alone, Working Solutions made \$6.9 million in small-dollar loans and grants to 223 small businesses — with 80% of loans under \$50,000 — and provided 12,215 hours of free technical assistance and business consulting.




